## About The Quilt

Finished quilt will measure $70^{\prime \prime} \times 84^{\prime \prime}$ and features just two fabrics oriented in a checkerboard layout.

Fabric Requirements

- Red Fabric: 3.25 Yards
- Cream Fabric: 3.25 Yards
- Binding Fabric: 1 Yard
- Backing Fabric: 5.5 Yards (40")



# Fabric Requirements \& Cutting lustructions 



## Before You Get Started...

Seam Allowance
The pattern assumes you're using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. To measure your seam allowance, gather 3 pieces of $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$ fabric and sew into a row, then measure the width of the center block. The center block should measure exactly 2.0" wide. If it's larger than $2.0^{\prime \prime}$ - your sewing too close to the edge of your fabric. If the center block is smaller than $2.0^{\prime \prime}$, your sewing too far away from the edge of your fabric.

## Fabric Requirements

Yardage requirements are generous enough to allow for starching before cutting.

## Quilt Assembly

## Assemble Strip Units

- Use (15) Fabric A and (15) Fabric B to sew together (15) strip sets of Fabric A/B.

## Sub-Cut 2-Patches

- From each of the (15) Fabric A/B strip sets, sub-cut (4) sections measuring 7.5" wide. After sub-cutting, you should have (60) two patch units, each measuring $7.5^{\prime \prime} \times 14.5^{\prime \prime}$.


## Build Row

- Use (60) of the two patch units to create (6) rows of 10 alternating the position of Fabric A/B to create a checkerboard effect.



## Sew the Rows Together

- Use (6) rows to sew them together ensuring that you continue the checkerboard effect.
